



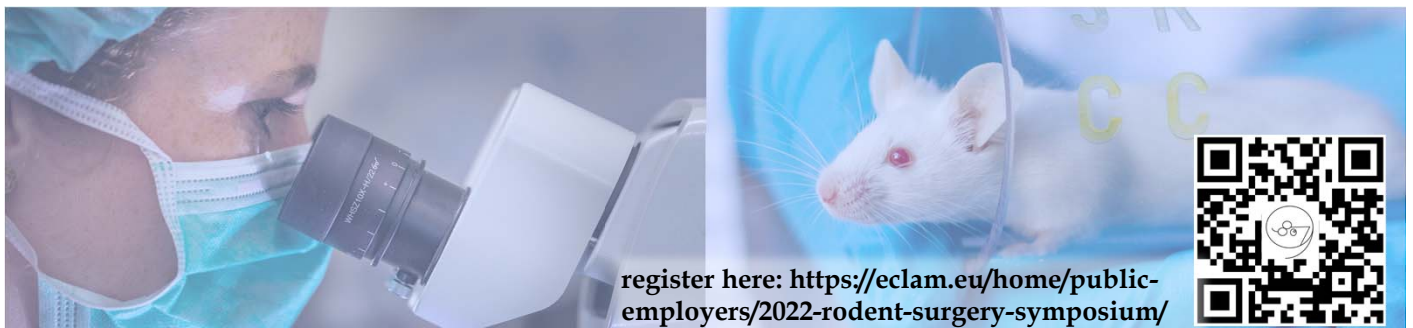
WE HAVE TO TALK ABOUT RODENT SURGERY
